Final 2023 Budget Update 4:07 p.m.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Dr. Phil Bondurant, <i>Director</i>, provided a final update on the 2023 Summit County Health Department Budget. There were no changes to overall budget although internal changes had occurred. The Council will possibly discuss the final Health Department Budget on December 14th. Dr. Bondurant will be watching the budget process closely throughout the month. Update on Trigger Law 4:10 p.m.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Derek Moss, <i>Nursing Director</i>, provided a Trigger Law update. He stated that SB174 is still on hold pending further investigation and further ruling. The State of Utah is still working under HB136 which means abortions are legal up to 18 weeks. The job of the Summit County Health Department is preventative. There are four nurse practitioners that specialize in women’s health available to talk to patients, refer and make recommendations depending upon the situation. The Health Department comes in on the preventative end and can provide long-term birth controls commonly known as LARCS. There are Federal programs available to the department making it possible to provide affordable contraception. They also try to work with manufacturers and State programs to further subsidize costs to keep the price low and to provide better birth control to residents of Summit County. • Board Members asked follow up questions to which Derek Moss responded. 	<p><i>Summary:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Derek Moss updated the Board on the Trigger Law.</i>
