


Summit County Health 2023 Annual Report

Behavioral Health Prevention

Prevention organized 36 events/classes and attended 12 community partner events. Through these events, we were able to spread our prevention message to 9,727 individuals of all ages across Summit County.



Communication & Public Engagement

In 2023, the Communication team improved access and awareness of public health resources through an ongoing rebranding campaign and website redesign. Launching in Spring 2024, the new site improves navigation for visitors and connects the community to programming or additional services they may benefit from.

Early Intervention

In 2023, Summit County Early Intervention Program improved access and awareness of our programs services to the community. Our marketing campaign utilized billboards, bus wraps, movie theater ads, brochures, and posters. Since implementing the marketing campaign, we have seen an increase in our referrals and service visits.

Clinical/Nursing

2023 realized increases in the clinical division's outreach efforts. Our 54 outreach events resulted in increased client visits for women's health, STI testing, and immunizations. We administered 4729 vaccines, and investigated 584 reportable diseases, in addition to our other services.



Epidemiology

The Epidemiology department enhanced and expanded our respiratory disease dashboard, incorporating advanced features and a broader scope of information to provide an even more comprehensive and insightful resource for our community in 2023. We are continuing to explore new ways to communicate data with our community.




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Public Health Emergency Preparedness

PHEP launched Project Public Health Ready (PPHR), a nationally recognized accreditation program, building capabilities to plan, respond, and recover from public health emergencies. In conjunction, we successfully launched our new Medical Reserve Corps program with the goal of increasing community emergency preparedness, communication, training, and volunteer opportunities.

Sustainability

The Sustainability team continued collaborating with other local government partners to advance clean energy initiatives for County government operations and the community. This work promotes the development of new clean energy resources in Utah that reduce air and water pollution.



Environmental Health

The Environmental Health team performed 4500 bacterial tests in the laboratory in 2023. Inspections were conducted on 400 restaurants and 115 septic systems were permitted. The hazmat remediation team provided oversight of an 11,000-gallon gasoline spill, to ensure the public's current and future well-being.



WIC

October's WIC resource fair featured 8 programs from Summit County Health and 18 community organizations. Attendees hoped to win 35 free raffle items donated by 15 entities. That night, new WIC appointment requests increased 33% compared to the average monthly requests for 2023.

Behavioral Health Clinical

Expanded behavioral health crisis services through increased hours of operation of the Mobile Crisis Outreach Team and improved behavioral health navigation and support of Spanish-speaking residents through collaborations with local non-profits and the Katz Amsterdam Foundation.

Health Promotion

To improve access and increase awareness of public health resources that benefit Summit County residents, Health Promotion staff offer community outreach programs aimed at engaging diverse and vulnerable populations. Our injury prevention program increased child safety measures in vehicles and bikes by providing helmet education and 48 car seat installations at outreach events and 526 doses of Naloxone were provided to families.
